FTA 2024 Circular Updates

Award Management Requirements Circular, C 5010.1F

Incorporates and updates guidance for award administration and management activities for all applicable FTA Federal assistance programs.



Replaces, consolidates, and updates guidance for Urbanized Area Formula Grants Program (5307); the State of Good Repair Grants Program (5337); and the Urbanized Area formula component of the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (5339(a)).

•Rural Areas Formula Grant Program Guidance, C 9040.1H

Replaces, consolidates and updates guidance for the Buses and Bus Facilities Program (5339(a)); Formula Grants for Rural Areas Program (5311); and the Tribal Transit Program (5311(c)).

Final Rule issued April 9, 2024 FTA tiered approach becomes effective October 9, 2024


Uniform Act – Revised Guidance and Regulations (Real Property Acquisition)

- Final revisions to 49 CFR part 24 became effective June 3, 2024.
- Ensure policies and procedures related to acquisitions or displacement of persons are up to date with the requirements of the final rule.
 - Maximum Benefit for Replacement Housing for Displaced Homeowners Increased to \$41,200
 - Maximum Benefit for Replacement Housing for Displaced Tenants Increased to \$9,570
 - Maximum Benefit for Nonresidential reestablishment Increased to \$33,200
 - Maximum Benefit for Nonresidential Moves Increased to \$53,200

General Directive 24-1: Required Actions Regarding Assaults on Transit Workers

General Directive 24-1 requires every transit agency subject to <u>FTA's Public Transportation Agency Safety Plans (PTASP)</u> regulation to do the following:

- Conduct a risk assessment of assaults on transit workers using the SMS processes in Agency Safety Plan
- If risk is unacceptable, must identify strategies to mitigate that risk
- Every transit agency serving a large, urbanized area must involve the joint labor-management Safety Committee when identifying safety risk mitigations and strategies.
- Each transit agency must provide information to FTA within 90 days on the risk level identified in its system, how it is mitigating those risks, and how it is monitoring the safety risk associated with assaults on transit workers.
